(Just One of) This Week's Big Stories - The trial

- Manhattan DA Alvin Bragg's Criminal Election Interference Case, Judge Juan Merchan presiding.
 - For context, here's the <u>timeline of events</u>.
 - Day 19, Monday
 - On redirect, Michael Cohen admitted that he stole \$30,000 from the Trump organization because he was mad that Trump stiffed him on his bonus.
 (Cohen pocketed \$30,000 that was supposed to go to a company called Red Finch.) Cohen also said he did some legal work for Trump in 2017 and 2018, but never billed anyone for it.
 - The prosecution rested their case, and the defense brought two witnesses to the stand.
 - The first presented a spreadsheet with phone numbers.
 - The second was Robert Costello, who in 2018 tried to become Michael Cohen's lawyer. Costello's testimony allowed prosecutor Susan Hoffinger to introduce into evidence emails sent by Costello indicating that Trump and Giuliani were trying to keep Cohen from flipping and were, therefore, part of the coverup.
 - Costello's conduct on the stand prompted Judge Juan Merchan to clear the court and chastise him (as later revealed in transcripts).
 Judge Merchan <u>described Costello's behavior as</u>
 "contemptuous" (staring down the judge, rolling his eyes, muttering
 "geez" as the judge sustained objections and saying "strike it!" as if he

were the judge. Costello's behavior could <u>spark a complaint</u> before the New York bar association.

- o Day 20, Tuesday
 - Cross-examination of Costello continued, with Costello admitting that he emailed his law partner and said that we need to get Cohen on the right page without it looking like we're taking instructions from Rudy Giuliani and Donald Trump.
 - The defense rested its case. Trump, of course, did not testify.
 - The rest of the day was spent on jury instructions, with prosecutors and defense attorneys presenting their points of view to Judge Merchan, who has to get them right because erroneous jury instructions have led to many reversals. So far, Judge Merchan has ruled that
 - The jurors do not have to agree on whether it was a tax crime or violations of state or federal election law that has elevated these normally misdemeanor charges to a felony.
 - Defense attorney Emil Bove <u>urged Judge Merchan to give an instruction about "the involvement" of counsel</u>, despite the judge's pretrial rulings that Trump could not argue that he was convinced of the lawfulness of his conduct because lawyers were involved. To use an "advice of counsel" defense, Trump would have had to waive attorney-client privilege and turned over his lawyer's notes to the prosecution before the trial started. Too late, Donnie!
- The trial is paused due to Memorial Day weekend and the normal "no trial" on Wednesday when Judge Merchan attends to other cases. The trial is expected to resume Tuesday with closing arguments, jury instructions and jury deliberations.
- Appeals court denies defense's bid for judge's recusal.
- Trump attorney Alina Habba <u>thinks</u> 'No one is above the law' is a 'stupid little catchphrase.'

Holding Trump Accountable (ordered by trial date)

- Special Counsel Jack Smith's Jan. 6 case; trial is stayed until SCOTUS makes a decision on presidential immunity. Oral arguments were heard April 25.
 - No news.
- Special Counsel Jack Smith's Documents Case; no longer set for May 20, 2024; Judge Aileen Cannon presiding and indefinitely postponed.
 - On Wednesday <u>Cannon heard</u> co-defendant Waltine Nauta's motion to dismiss the charges against him for "vindictive prosecution." Jack Smith's team referred to the motion as "garbage."
 - In 2023, D.C. federal judge Beryl Howell wrote a <u>ruling</u> that was released this week
 in which the judge <u>took apart the claims of Trumps' lawyers</u> and demonstrated that,
 if not for Cannon's delay tactics, this case would already have been tried.
 - Judge Howell's ruling also reveals that <u>sensitive files were found in Trump's</u> <u>bedroom</u> four months after the FBI search.
- DA Fani Willis Election Interference RICO Case; no trial date
 - Watch Rachel Maddow's interview with DA Fani Willis. The GOP is doing everything they can to disqualify DA Willis, even though her relationship with Nathan Wade in no way disqualifies her: So far:
 - The Georgia legislature has <u>passed a law</u> creating a commission (staffed by GOP appointees) to do oversight over district attorneys.

- The Georgia state senate has <u>started a special investigation</u> of DA Willis.
- The chairman of the Fulton County Audit Committee has <u>demanded</u> that DA Willis respond to allegations that she "misused" funds.
- Marjorie Taylor Greene (R-GA) has <u>filed two ethics complaints</u> against DA
 Willis and called for an investigation.
- Jim Jordan (R-OH) has <u>threatened DA Willis</u> with contempt if she doesn't comply with subpoena in federal funding probe.
- Ron Johnson (R-WI) and Chuck Grassley (R-IA) are <u>conducting their own</u> investigation of DA Willis.

• Arizona Fake Electors case

o On Tuesday, Rudy Giuliani, John Eastman, former Arizona GOP Chair Kelli Ward and her husband, Michael Ward; state Sen. Anthony Kern; Robert Montgomery, the former head of the Cochise County GOP; Republican Party activists Samuel Moorhead, Nancy Cottle and Loraine Pellegrino; Greg Safsten, the former Arizona GOP executive director; former Trump attorney Christina Bobb (now the RNC's "election integrity" point person); and Tyler Bowyer, the Republican National Committee's Arizona committeeman and chief operating officer of the Trumpaligned Turning Point Action were arraigned. Giuliani appeared via telephone and was required to appear in person within 30 days and post a \$10,000 bond. Mark Meadows, Boris Epshteyn, Michael Roman and Jenna Ellis remain to be arraigned. Read the indictment.

Enablers

- Rudy Giuliani
 - He has <u>agreed to stop spreading 2020 election lies</u> about Georgia election workers.
 - He's taken a page from Trump and is selling coffee now. Reactions pour in.

Other Trump news

 DJT closed at \$45.81 today. On Tuesday, DJT closed at \$44 in after-hours trading after reporting a big loss and scant revenue.

Elections

President Biden's campaign

- Remember when GOP-ers were in an uproar that Trump might not be on the Colorado ballot? So far, it looks like <u>Joe Biden won't be on the Ohio ballot</u> due entirely to GOP control of that state.
- What's up with the 17% of voters who blame Biden for the fall of Roe v. Wade?
- The Biden administration is canceling student loans for another 160,000 borrowers.
- Democratic and Republican pollsters are finding a shocking number of undecideds or Republicans who will not vote for Trump because of his talk of trying to make himself eligible for a third term, or eliminating term limits entirely, or elections entirely. The reason: The Supreme Court, including the overturning of Roe v. Wade.

These results are discussed in "A Hidden Variable in the Presidential Race: Fears of 'Trump Forever," by Joshua Greene at Bloomberg.com, but it's behind a firewall. - Ohio governor Mike DeWine (R) has <u>called the state's legislature into session</u> this Tuesday to fix a little problem: if the legislature does not act, Joe Biden will not be on the ballot in November.

• Trump campaign

- Caught on video, Trump <u>says he's 'looking at'</u> restricting contraception access —
 then says he never said that but will have an "interesting" policy announcement
 "very shortly."
- Trump is now <u>fundraising off of boilerplate</u> that appears on every FBI search warrant stating that the FBI can only use deadly force if an officer or another person faces "imminent danger of death or serious physical injury." On that basis, Trump claims "Joe Biden was locked & loaded ready to take me out & put my family in danger." In fact, the FBI coordinated with Trump's Secret Service detail to make sure Trump was NOT at Mar-a-Lago when the search warrant was executed.
- The Trump campaign is <u>blaming "human printer" Natalie Harp</u> for posting a video on Trump's social media site that includes a fabricated news article in which it claims Trump's election will create a "<u>united Reich</u>." "No one spends as much time on this campaign around him as Natalie," one person told The Bulwark. "If people think she's an airhead because of her looks, they don't understand how smart she is and how much the president relies on her." The post was taken down after 15 hours.
 - 'Not an Accident': Trump's 'Unified Reich' video <u>alarms historians and</u> <u>fascism experts</u>.
- Constitutional scholar, Laurence Tribe, <u>warns</u> that 'Trumpers' want to end major civil right: the right of privacy, from which the right to use contraceptives derives. In a 2022 video, Marsha Blackburn (R-TN) declares *Griswold vs. Connecticut* (which legalized the use of contraceptives) to be a "constitutionally unsound" ruling.
- Nikki Haley flamed out, saying <u>she will vote for Trump</u>, the candidate she once called unqualified and unhinged.

U.S. Senate Races

- Democratic Sen. Jon Tester <u>bucks Joe Biden</u> amid tough reelection fight.
- Kari Lake's MAGA lawyer dodges disciplinary hearing in effort to avoid disbarment.
- Maryland Gov. Wes Moore (D) stakes his reputation to <u>elect Democrat Angela</u>
 <u>Alsobrooks</u> to the U.S. Senate. She's running against former governor, Larry Hogan (R).

U.S. House

With the majority opinion written by Alito, by a 6-3 vote, the Supreme Court <u>let a racial gerrymander stand</u> in South Carolina's CD 1, currently held by Nancy Mace (R), by calling it a partisan gerrymander, which SCOTUS decided in 2019 is constitutional.

- This decision will hamper the ability of voters to fight unfair maps in the future because it <u>changes the standard</u> for bringing racial gerrymandering claims.
- From the "Reagan Revolution," <u>Alito</u> and <u>Roberts</u> have a <u>long history of undermining the Voting Rights Act</u>.
- Justice Kagan wrote a fiery dissent.
- Which party will control the U.S. House in 2025? After a shift in April, Democrats now lead by 1.2 percent (45.2 percent to 44 percent) in the <u>RealClearPolitics</u> averages of polls measuring generic congressional preferences and by 0.8 percent (44.5 percent to 43.7 percent) in the <u>FiveThirtyEight averages</u>. President Biden and His Administration

- Karim Khan, a prosecutor for the International Criminal Court, has accused Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Defense Minister Yoav Gallant of war crimes over Gaza and has requested subpoenas for them. <u>President Biden is still supporting Israel.</u>
- President Biden is <u>trying to confirm more than 234 judges</u> (the number confirmed during Trump's presidency).
- On Thursday, the DOJ <u>filed an anti-trust lawsuit</u> against <u>Ticketmaster</u> and parent company <u>Live Nation</u>, seeking to break up what officials call an unlawful monopoly that's squeezing artists, promoters and venues while jacking up prices for fans.

In Congress

Senate

- On Wednesday, with the Senate's confirmation of Angela Martinez to a U.S. district court in Arizona, <u>Joe Biden's 200th judicial nominee</u> was confirmed. Biden has surpassed the number of lifetime federal judges that Trump had confirmed by the same point in his presidency.
- Dozens of pro bono attorneys back Biden's beleaguered court pick. Adeel Mangi.
- Congress to vote on <u>repealing a rule</u> that would save Americans \$1.5 billion a year on heating. The rule would raise the efficiency standards on natural gas furnaces, and builders are fighting back.
- Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) <u>unveils bill</u> to boost Justice Department's power to hold police accountable.
- Schumer plans Senate vote on birth control protections next month.
- Senate <u>Democrats urge the DOJ to rescind</u> Trump-era legal memo on executions.
- Republicans unite to block border bill again. They were joined by Sens. Corey Booker (D-NJ) and Alex Padilla (D-CA). Lisa Murkowski (R-AK) was the only Republican to vote for the bill.
- Congress and campaigns <u>engage in tug-of-war</u> over gas prices as summer travel begins.
- U.S. Senate Democrats tie state abortion bans to fewer beginning physicians.
- As Memorial Day arrives, Sen. Patty Murray (D) and Thom Tillis (R) <u>unveiled a bill</u> to assist Purple Heart recipients.

House

- Republicans plan new criminal investigation into Hunter Biden.
- James Comer (R-KY) and Rep. Katie Porter (D-CA) are <u>introducing a presidential</u>
 ethics <u>bill</u> that would require the president and vice president to disclose tax returns
 for two years preceding office, any foreign payments received, family members
 accompanying them on official travel and conflicts of interest.
- In a speech on the House floor, Rep. Jim McGovern (D-MA) said "a candidate for President of the United States is on trial for sending a hush money payment to a porn star to avoid a sex scandal during his 2016 campaign," and got punished for it.
- Less than 1% of bills introduced this Congress have become law.

In the Courts

Supreme Court

No decision on Trump immunity claim.

- Alito
 - "Why Was Alito Flying the Flag Upside Down After January 6?" by Adam Sewer at The Atlantic.
 - The far-right, white nationalist "Appeal to Heaven" flag <u>was flown outside</u>
 <u>Alito's beach house</u>. Also, the Supreme Court has known about the upsidedown flag flown at Alito's Washington, D.C. home for months. And, remote
 learning was in effect in January 2021, so kids were NOT at the bus stop and
 did not see the oh-so-offensive "Fuck Trump" sign in a neighbor's yard.
 - Alito <u>sold Bud Light stock</u> and bought Coors stock during the boycott sparked by Anheuser-Busch's use of a transgender woman in an advertisement.

· Lower Federal Courts
