(Just One of) This Week's Big Stories - The trial

- Manhattan DA Alvin Bragg's Criminal Election Interference Case, Judge Juan Merchan presiding.
 - Trump follows up 34-count conviction with 30-minute free-association ramble.
 - Fact checking Trump's remarks after historic conviction in election interference trial.
 - Democrats push back at argument guilty verdict strengthens Trump.
 - Reuters/Ipsos: 10% of GOP voters say they are less likely to vote for Trump. 8% of those identifying of identifying as Trump supporters and 15% of GOP voters say Trump should drop out. Reuters has Biden leading 41% to 39%.
 - Morning Consult: 49% of Independents think Trump should drop out postguilty verdict is Biden 45% to 44%.
 - ABC News: Half of Americans think Trump's guilty verdict was correct and he should end his campaign.

- "I Was In The Courtroom When Donald Trump Was Found Guilty. <u>Here's What You</u> Didn't See."
- After Trump conviction, GOP lawmakers attacked the U.S. justice system.
 - For example, <u>Kristie Noem (R-SD)</u>.
 - Mike Johnson <u>begs Supreme Court</u> to save dear leader.
- DA Alvin Bragg graduated from Harvard College with a Bachelor of Arts, cum laude, in 1995 with a major in government. Here's the article that appeared in the Harvard Crimson on June 8, 1995 entitled, "<u>The Anointed One</u>."
- Judge Juan Merchan <u>could take the E. Jean Carroll case into account</u> when deciding how to sentence Trump for his 34-count criminal conviction over falsified business records.
- What's next after Trump's criminal conviction? A huge test for Judge Juan Merchan.
- Trump's election interference conviction: What happens next.
 - How might Judge Merchan treat Trump? These defendants know.
 - He can still vote in Florida, according to Ron DeSantis.
 - The U.K., Australia and Canada have <u>strict restrictions</u> on felons traveling there. Felons are banned from entering China.
 - Loss of gun rights.
 - How Trump will <u>appeal the verdict</u>.
- Americans <u>largely split on whether they approve</u> of Trump's conviction.
- Trump is in uncharted territory. The <u>full effect of the verdict</u> won't sink in overnight.
- Hillary Clinton <u>reacted to the verdict</u> with just four words: "Anything going on today?"

Holding Trump Accountable

- Special Counsel Jack Smith's Jan. 6 case; trial is stayed until SCOTUS makes a decision on presidential immunity. Oral arguments were heard April 25.
 - No news.
- Special Counsel Jack Smith's Documents Case; no longer set for May 20, 2024; Judge Aileen Cannon presiding and indefinitely postponed.
 - Prosecutors ask judge in classified documents case to <u>block Trump from</u> <u>statements endangering law enforcement</u>.
 - Judge Cannon <u>denied the special counsel's request</u> to impose gag order on Trump over Trump's false claim that the agents who conducted the search of Mar-a-Lago planned to assassinate him. Cannon threatened the prosecutors with sanctions.
 - Smith makes a new plea for gag order to protect law enforcement from Trump.
 - More than 1,000 appeals court <u>complaints seek Judge Cannon's removal</u> from Trump case. Be sure to <u>add your own!</u>
- DA Fani Willis Election Interference RICO Case; no trial date
 - DA Fani Willis <u>appeals decision to dismiss</u> some of the charges in Trump election case. In March, Judge Scott McAfee <u>dismissed three charges</u> against Trump:
 - That defendant Trump solicited the Speaker of the Georgia House of Representatives to violate his oath of office on December 7, 2020, by requesting or importuning him to call a special session to unlawfully appoint presidential electors.
 - That defendants Trump and Mark Meadows solicited the Georgia Secretary of State to violate his oath of office on January 2, 2021, by requesting or importuning him to unlawfully influence the certified election returns.

- That defendant Trump solicited the Georgia Secretary of State to violate his oath of office on September 17, 2021, by requesting or importuning him to unlawfully decertify the election.
- DA Willis won her Democratic primary on May 22. Judge McAfee won his nonpartisan election to keep his seat.
- The Georgia Senate held a hearing as part of their investigation into DA Fani Willis. Watch the hearing.

President Biden's campaign

- Democrats will have to <u>nominate Biden virtually</u> to bypass Ohio's GOP-controlled intransigent legislature.
- Biden campaign plans to get more aggressive once Trump trial ends.
- Biden's use of the bully pulpit on greedflation has some effect: Walgreens joins
 Target, Amazon, Walmart in announcing steep summer price cuts.

In Washington

President Biden and His Administration

 - U.S. bans maker of spyware used to target government officials and journalists.

In Congress

Senate

- After the Trump verdict in New York, Senate conservatives <u>vow to oppose DOJ funding boost</u> and Biden nominees.
 - Eight GOP senators say they'll slow the Senate even further because of the Trump verdict. They are Mike Lee (R-UT), J.D. Vance (R-OH), Tommy Tuberville (R-AL), Eric Schmitt (R-MO), Marsha Blackburn (R-TN), Rick Scott (R-FL), Roger Marshall (R-KS.) and Marco Rubio (R-FL). What can we do?
 - Support <u>Democrat Debbie Mucarsel-Powell</u> (running against Scott).
 - Support <u>Democrat Gloria Johnson</u> (running against Blackburn).
- A birth control access advocacy group <u>launched an ad campaign ahead of Senate</u> vote.

- Lawmakers <u>pressure President Biden to change</u> the administration's struggling Sudan policy.
- Sen. Joe Manchin has <u>registered as an Independent</u>. Manchin did not disclose if he will continue caucusing with Democrats.

House

- Trump pressures Republicans to pass a law to keep him out of jail forever.
- House passes bill outlining <u>new framework for crypto regulation</u> despite SEC pushback.
- U.S. leaders invite Netanyahu to deliver an address to Congress.
- Thanks to Rep. Katie Porter (D-CA) there's a <u>bipartisan push to make air travel</u> <u>easier</u> for new parents packing breast milk and formula.

Supreme Court

- · No decision on Trump immunity claim.
- Supreme Court <u>revives NRA's lawsuit alleging</u> that New York violated its First Amendment rights
- Alito
 - Alito has <u>rejected calls from members of the Senate Judiciary Committee to</u> <u>quit Supreme Court cases</u> on Trump and Jan. 6 because of flag controversies.
 - The Washington Post decided not to publish their reporting on the upsidedown flag in January 2021. Here's what they've published now: "Wife of Justice Alito called upside-down flag 'signal of distress"
 - The Alito scandal is worse than it seems.
 - Neighbor claims Alito's security detail was used to threaten her.
